This term's theme


This terms theme is 'Ready, Steady, Cook'. The children will look at different foods and where they come from along with the seasonality of food and the reasons as to why we import and export food.

Other learning activities


Monday – Spelling test with the previous weeks' spellings

Reading:

If you have been with Wouldham School for a while, you may be accustomed to filling in a reading record book with your child. During year 5 and 6, we do not require the children to maintain a reading record. Rather, we prefer for children to take responsibility for their own learning and treat reading as an enjoyable pastime as opposed to something they are required to do.



During the course of the year, we will encourage the children to read from a variety of different genres to enhance their vocabulary and learn how different authors write. If we/you feel that this arrangement doesn't work then we will speak to you to discuss other options.

Raven Class regularly visit Strood Library. This will always be on a Wednesday afternoon. We expect the children to take responsibility for their library cards – most choose to keep it in a secure pocket in their school bag. Do let us know if you require the forms necessary to obtain a library card.

Mathletics:



Alongside the daily maths lessons, we encourage the children to participate in 'Mathletics'. Mathletics is a web-based program which the school subscribes to. Each child will have their own login and can benefit

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from extra learning when at home. Experience tends to show that those who spend a little extra time on Mathletics in their own time perform better at maths. When a child achieves 1000 points on Mathletics, they will receive a certificate which we paste into their book; they'll also get a few 'Raven Coins' as an acknowledgement of their extra effort!

Home Learning Challenges:

Home learning challenges are designed to further the children's learning. We expect the children to spend a minimum of 20 minutes per week on one of a selection of challenges. These will be related to the current theme being undertaken and typically comprise of maths, English and creative oriented activities.

Rewards:

Raven Class enjoy a unique reward system:

Just as we, as adults, get paid for working hard, so too do the children. Intended to



incentivise and instil some 'money sense' at the same time, the children can earn 'Raven Coins' for producing work that is of exceptional quality or for going above and beyond. As the children earn their coins, they can decide whether to spend or save up for something from the Raven Shop whether it be merchandise or even a Virtual Reality experience!

House Teams:
