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Quick reference guide for parents. What should I do if....

What should I do if	Action needed	Return to school when
My child has Covid-19 symptoms including any of the following: • A new continuous cough • A high temperature • A loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell	 Do not come to school Contact school to inform us Self-isolate the whole household Get a test https://self-referral.test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/antigen/name Inform the school immediately about the test result 	The test comes back negative or a period of ten days has passed since the symptoms started, and the child feels well.
My child tests positive for Covid-19	 Do not come to school Contact school to inform us Self-isolate the whole household 	10 days have passed since symptoms began, even if they still have a cough or loss of taste/smell (these symptoms can last for several weeks) AND the child feels well.
My child tests negative	 Contact school to inform us Discuss when your child can come back (same day/next day) 	The test comes back negative.
My child is ill with symptoms not linked to Covid-19 but could be contagious (i.e. sickness) or is too ill to come to school	 Do not come to school Contact school to inform us Ring on each day of their illness 	After 24 hours following the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea or when feeling well enough if not sickness related.
Someone in my household has Covid-19 symptoms	 Do not come to school Contact school to inform us Self-isolate the whole household Affected household member to get a test Inform the school immediately about the test result 	The test comes back negative.
Someone in my household tests positive for Covid-19	 Do not come to school Contact school to inform us Self-isolate the whole household 	The child has completed 14 days of isolation.
NHS test and trace has identified my child as a close contact of somebody with symptoms of confirmed Covid-19	 Do not come to school Contact school to inform us The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate 	The child has completed 14 days of isolation.

What should I do if	Action needed	Return to school when
NHS test and trace has identified a household member (other than my child) as a close contact of somebody with symptoms or confirmed Covid-19	 The household member must self-isolate for 14 days Child can continue to attend school 	Child can continue to attend school.
A sibling attending another school has been sent home to isolate due to there being a positive case in their school	 Sibling must isolate for 14 days Child/ren attending our school can continue to attend 	Child can continue to attend school.
I have travelled from a country that requires us to quarantine but my child didn't travel	 As long as you do not have/have not had symptoms in the last 14 days your child can continue to attend school. The person who has travelled MUST NOT leave the house, including to do pickups and drop offs. 	Child can continue to attend school.
We have received medical advice that my child must resume shielding	 Do not come to school Contact school to inform us Shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again 	School inform you that restrictions have been lifted and your child can return to school again. OR You receive medical advice that your child may return to school.
My child's 'bubble' is closed due to a Covid-19 outbreak in school	 Child must not come to school Child must not come on to the school site Support your child at home with remote education provided by your school Your child will need to self-isolate for 14 days Other siblings may continue to attend school 	School will inform you that the bubble will be reopened.
A family member has an operation and it is advised that they and their family need to self-isolate	 Do not come to school Contact school to inform us Provide medical evidence to the school 	The child has completed the advised self-isolation period.
I am unable to get a test for someone in the household who has symptoms	 If you are not able to get a test in the first 5 days of having symptoms, your child and anyone they live with must stay at home and self-isolate for 14 days. If you have tried to get a test but failed to get anywhere by the end of your third day then contact the school for help. 	The child has completed 14 days of isolation or a negative test result has been received.
